The summer months bring our busiest and most challenging time for policing with a number of high profile events across North Norfolk including the increasingly popular carnivals in Wells, Sheringham and Cromer. We have planned to provide a policing presence at as many events as we can and are lucky to have so much support from our Special Constabulary and event organisers. These events create a lot of work behind the scenes for Police and colleagues on the Safety Advisory Group (SAG) who are there to provide advice, guidance and support in planning safe events. If you are planning an event then they are your first point of call.

Finally, we always encourage a bit of extra home security at this time of year. Most burglars are opportunist so if you take away the opportunity by locking your doors and windows and checking your alarms this helps to make things a bit safer. Crime Updates (1st to 31st July 2019)

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	1	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary - Residential	1	Entry and theft to any building within the curtilage/boundary of a residence.
Burglary - Business and Community	0	Entry and theft to any building or structure not within the curtilage/ boundary of a residence.
Criminal Damage	1	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	1	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	1	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	2	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	1	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	1	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a Burglary Residential.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
