## Message from you local Inspector, Teresa Futter

There have been some concerns locally following a number of dwelling burglaries across the area, specifically in Irstead, Hoveton and Stalham. These incidents are being investigated robustly by CID. Marked police patrols along with your Beat Manager, PC Tom Gibbs, are conducting high profile, pro-active patrols across the area both on the main trunk roads targeting vehicle movements and providing reassurance by getting out in the villages and towns both during the day time and at night. Please remain Vigilant and report any suspicious activity. PC Gibbs continues to conduct targeted visible patrols around the schools with a view to reducing vehicle related issues such as speeding, parking, seatbelt and mobile phone offences. He has issued a number of verbal warnings to drivers and traffic offence reports have been submitted for action in relation to speeding matters. PC Gibbs will be holding a public engagement surgery at Stalham Town Hall on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> December between 10.30 and 11.30 am. ## Crime Updates (1st to 30th November 2019)

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	2	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary - Residential	2	Entry and theft to any building within the curtilage/boundary of a residence.
Burglary - Business and Community	0	Entry and theft to any building or structure not within the curtilage/ boundary of a residence.
Criminal Damage	1	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	1	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	1	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	1	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a Burglary Residential.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
