Message from you local Inspector, Teresa Futter

Police are continuing to concentrate their patrols in Hoveton and surrounding parishes as a result of the increase of the report of burglaries in the area. If you see any suspicious activity please report it. Police have also received reports of hare coursing. Again we ask you to be vigilant and report this to 101 or your Beat Manager PC Tom Gibbs. Please obtain any index numbers of vehicles involved when you can. New SNAP priorities have been identified and PC Gibbs has been working alongside SC Hollingshead to conduct enforcement on these which has led to a number of drivers being reported for speeding, no insurance and other traffic related offences.

Crime Updates (1st to 31st January 2020)

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	2	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary - Residential	1	Entry and theft to any building within the curtilage/boundary of a residence.
Burglary - Business and Community	1	Entry and theft to any building or structure not within the curtilage/ boundary of a residence.
Criminal Damage	3	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	3	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	0	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	2	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	3	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	1	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	1	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a Burglary Residential.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.

Message from your Engagement Officer, PC Pete Davison

I am often asked "When should I call 999"? Hopefully the following advice will help.

You should always call 999 if: you or someone else is in immediate danger; if the crime is in progress; or, you need police help immediately.

This could include: Someone using violence or threatening violence; If there is a danger to life; Serious damage is being or could be caused to a property; A potential criminal has been disturbed or stopped; A road traffic accident where someone is hurt or a danger is being caused to other road users.
