

Dear All,

When I wrote this letter last month, I hoped that by the time I wrote this one we would be looking at when we could meet together again. Sadly, this still seems to be some time away. But we are still here, and still the church and we are finding new ways of working in our communities. On TV I recently saw an advert for faith programmes on the radio in the coming weeks. It showed images from many world faiths and invited people to join in the services broadcast, with the assurance that faith isn't about a building, but is in our own front rooms. This triggered several thoughts. Firstly, absolutely right, faith isn't about a building. We may meet in a building to express our faith, to worship together and to feed ourselves spiritually, but our faith doesn't stop in that building, however beautiful it may be. But I'd argue that it doesn't stop in our front rooms either - the real worked out expression of faith is shown in the lives we live in the communities we serve.

Here in the Wroxham Benefice we serve the communities of Wroxham, Hoveton, Belaugh and Tunstead and we are still here, working to be with you despite the closed buildings, whether you usually come to one of our churches or have never thought of crossing the threshold. In this very different time we are working that service out in many different ways, and we are learning day by day.

Together with other community groups we are working as Operation Good Neighbour to help with collecting food parcels and prescriptions if you are stuck at home. We are looking forward this month to Ascension Day, Pentecost and Trinity and we will have lots of new resources for you. We do know how hard this time is for everyone. We are all missing friends and family, and it is so hard to not know when we will see them again. Self isolating can be lonely, but we don't have to be alone. Please ask if there is anything you need. We are here to help. We are still church, still here, and still working for and with you all.

GARDENING TIPS FOR MAY

We are all experiencing very difficult times at the moment.

This April you will have appreciated the fine display of daffs, tulips and other spring flowering plants.

If you have been furloughed or are self-isolating this is a good time to really enjoy the wonders of nature in your own garden; whether it's admiring the bird life or the different range of flowers out at this time of year.

Also, whilst on your daily exercise look at other people's gardens and get a few new ideas or see other plants you may not have noticed in the past.

Here are some jobs which can be done in May.

Dead head daffs and when they have died down pull the leaves off.

Also, cut back aubrietia and yellow alyssum after it's flowered.

Your perennials should be growing well. Hoe regularly and stake, if necessary.

When ribes sanguineum (flowering currant), forsythia and viburnum tinus have flowered prune, if required.

Tie in new growth on your wall shrubs and climbers.

Trim lawns regularly, feed if looking a little yellow and treat any weeds with a selective weed killer; keep edges trimmed.

In the veg garden broad beans should be growing well.

Early potatoes should be showing their heads, mound up with an iron rake.

Sow lettuce, radish, onions, peas, beetroot and main crop carrots.

Sow climbing French and runner beans in cell trays or if preferred, straight into the ground.

Shading should already be up in the greenhouse as our spring weather was rather warm.

At the end of the month, clear areas of spring bedding and lift tulips, ready for the summer bedding.

Check pots for vine weevil.

Watch out for late frosts and protect tender plants.

With the pond, clean pumps and filters regularly. Top up the pond when required.

Gardening can be a relaxing hobby. Enjoy the beauty of gardening, especially during these challenging times.

Coronavirus Contingency & Action Plan

Hoveton Parish Council formally adopted its Coronavirus Contingency & Action Plan on $23^{\rm rd}$ March 2020. The plan, which has been published on our website, sets out the contingency measures your Parish Council



has brought into effect as a result of the Coronavirus pandemic. The plan aims to ensure Hoveton Parish Council will be able to operate its business to the best of its abilities throughout this public health emergency while protecting, as far as is reasonably possible, its members, employees, and volunteers. The plan was prepared by our Parish Clerk with reference to the latest advice issued by the UK Government, the Society of Local Council Clerks, and the National Association of Local Councils, and with reference to the Parish Council's Standing Orders and Financial Regulations. It will be continuously reviewed and updated to take account of the changing status of the pandemic.

Hoveton Parish Council Meetings

Hoveton Parish Council last met as a full Council on Monday 2^{nd} March 2020. Due to the Coronavirus pandemic, it wasn't possible for your Parish Council to meet as scheduled on Monday 6^{th} April and all Council meetings have now been cancelled until further notice, including the Annual Parish Meeting scheduled for Monday 4^{th} May. However, despite not being able to meet in person, your Parish Council continues to work hard on behalf of the local community and it remains very busy behind-the-scenes.

In order to keep local residents updated on the work the Parish Council is doing, our Clerk has drafted a Record of Decisions & Actions taken since 2nd March in accordance with our approved Coronavirus Contingency & Action Plan. This is available on our website or on request from the Clerk (clerk@hoveton-pc.org.uk or 07572 349600). Should the restrictions currently in place due to Coronavirus continue in the longer term, your Parish Council hopes it may be possible to hold virtual Council meetings which will be made accessible to members of the public.

Coronavirus Community Assistance

Operation Good Neighbour Hoveton & Wroxham is now up and running. This scheme is coordinating local volunteers and is arranging for the delivery of food and medicine to residents who have no other means of support. Operation Good Neighbour is run by the Wroxham and Hoveton Good Neighbours Scheme (part of Community Action Norfolk), supported by the local Church, local Councillors for Wroxham and Hoveton, and the Parish Councils of Hoveton and Wroxham. For more information, visit https://goodneighbour.wroxhambenefice.org or call Clare (07341 873375) or Tracy (01603 784651) if you are in urgent need of a food delivery.

In order to provide assistance to local residents, North Norfolk District Council has developed a hub and bespoke support model throughout the district, with a physical coordination presence at ten Local Coordination Centres, including a centre based at Hoveton Village Hall (please note that these centres are not open to the public, and should only be accessed by registered community volunteers). North Norfolk residents in need of support, either now or in the coming weeks, can request assistance through the Norfolk helpline (0344 8008020) or the North Norfolk helpline (01263 516000).

Brook Park Phase II Planning Application Response

Thank you again to the many residents who took the time to attend the recent public meeting regarding the proposed development of Brook Park Phase II by Persimmon Homes. Hoveton Parish Council has now submitted a summary of this public meeting to North Norfolk District Council along with our response to planning application PF/19/1659. Your Parish Council has strongly objected to this planning application, and both our full consultation response and the public meeting summary can now be viewed on our website or are available on request from our Clerk.

Stalham Road Speed Limit Update

At the end of 2019, Hoveton Parish Council wrote to Norfolk County Council to request that the speed limit on the 40mph residential section of Stalham Road be reduced to 30mph. Despite backing up this request with data gathered from our SAM2 sign and referencing the criteria for change outlined in the Norfolk Speed Management Strategy, NCC turned down our request for a speed limit reduction. In March, we sent a follow-up letter to NCC in order to press this issue further, but unfortunately our request to reduce the speed limit was again refused. We have been told the location's personal injury accident history doesn't support the perception that this road is particularly dangerous, and that the traffic regulation order costs which would need to accompany the speed limit change would not be seen as cost effective.

Community Flowerbeds Volunteers

Work on Hoveton's community flowerbeds is temporarily on hold until further notice due to the Coronavirus pandemic, but most of the flowerbeds are now in full bloom and are looking blooming lovely. A huge thank you to our volunteers for all their hard work and for helping to brighten up our village in these difficult times!

NORTH NORFOLK DISTRICT COUNCIL

Message from County & District Councillor Nigel Dixon

Hoveton, Brook Park – Phase 2. The formal public consultation has closed and the planning application is being processed taking into account all the representations made to NNDC. I have discussed the matter with the Case Officer to understand what the key issues are and how it might be progressed. It's very clear there's long list of major



concerns to be resolved; many of them are conflicts with planning policies which NNDC will not accept. The most important being the principle of building on land which hasn't yet been allocated for development, and that includes issues over infrastructure and local services capacity constraints. Then there's concerns over the extremely high housing density, the site and road layout and alignment and how it integrates with the existing Phase 1 and the surrounding countryside. That's all before you consider issues over building design, environmental impact and community benefits. Just the key issues are likely to take several months to resolve because they will require extensive negotiations, principally, with Persimmon and the land owner. NNDC is therefore not expecting a quick outcome to the application; in all respects that's a good sign showing a high level of attention to points which have rightly been raised by a wide range of objectors. I will keep you advised as and when I hear further signs of an outcome; in the meantime I remain optimistic that fair justice will be done.

Covid19. I won't bore you with repeats of important information about do's and don'ts of the new world we are adjusting to, but I should explain that the County and District Councils are extremely busy implementing many of the central government directives to support people and businesses while adjusting to mostly working remotely from home. That inevitably impacts on the delivery of the range of usual services; however, the most important priorities are being maintained and others will follow either as the lock-down restrictions are relaxed or as new ways of working are found. Nearly all meetings are now conducted remotely using virtual applications over the internet. Many of you will know NNDC has set up 10 Local Coordination Centres across the District; there's one in Hoveton Village Hall and it can be contacted on: hoveton.lcc@north-norfolk.gov.uk (or 01263 516213 or 07949 373985 (staffed 10.00 to 16.00 Mon - Fri). The LCC is working with local community volunteer groups and suppliers to try to ensure all vulnerable people are appropriately supported. If you are aware of anyone who may not be supported or is struggling to cope then please contact the LCC or the Wroxham & Hoveton Good Neighbour Scheme on 07501 362793 or Operation Good Neighbour on hovetonwroxham.goodneighbour@gmail.com or 07950 320461. I am aware there are many other clubs, activity or next door/across the road groups that are informally contacting people to ensure their shopping, medication and general wellbeing needs are met and that's really good to see. However, there may still be those, most hard to reach, that are struggling silently and out of sight - please alert any of the above contacts, or me, if you suspect someone isn't supported.

Finally, my thanks to the many who have registered as volunteers or acting as coordinators for the various national and local help schemes such as the NHS/RVS Goodsam and the local Good Neighbour Schemes. Although many may not have been called upon yet they may well do as the Covid19 restrictions are likely to run for many months yet.






