With more than 12,000 homes across Norfolk now in a No Cold Calling Zone, more people than ever are saying no to cold callers. Feedback shows the zones really work with a drop in the number of cold callers seen in 99% of areas.

No Cold Calling Zones give householders the confidence to tell rogue traders they are not welcome and are likely to be reported to Trading Standards if they do call at homes in a zone.

Figures show that 85% of people in a No Cold Calling Zone felt able to tell a cold caller they were in a zone and should leave.

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR AREA?

Over the last month, efforts have been made to get the message out about telephone-based Fraud by circulating information handouts via post offices and village shops with a brief to share the information with any customers from their community who may be considered vulnerable due to age or other vulnerability. Information also shared with Parish Councils for dissemination around their communities via Parish Newsletters or magazines in line with SNAP priorities. Also SNAP related parking and traffic speeding issues across the area.

For the coming Month there will be an emphasis on speeding in some of the communities who have identified an issue through their SAM 2 camera deployments. The Beat Manager will be giving attention to Catfield, Potter Heigham, Hickling, Sutton and Neatishead as agreed at SNAP but could pop up anywhere. There will also be some targeted engagement and crime prevention activity around the boatyards, staithe and camp sites as we head towards what is likely to be a busy summer season on the coast and rivers. This is also in line with the SNAP panel priority setting meeting held 07.04.21.

CRIME UPDATES (1st to 31st March)

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	1	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary business and community	0	A person commits theft in a building or structure that is not lived in.
Burglary residential	0	Entry and theft in a building or a structure that is lived in.
Criminal Damage	0	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	4	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	1	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	0	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
